Mālō e lelei	Greetings / Hello
Mālō e lelei	Greetings everyone

Nofo ā	Goodbye – to those who are staying / Goodbye on the phone
Fakamolemole / Kātaki	Please
Mālō 'aupito	Thank you very much
Fakamolemole	Sorry
Tulou / Kātaki fakamolemole	Excuse me
