



During term two we were very fortunate to have Sharon Pihema from the Asthma and Respiratory Foundation NZ working with our students related to vaping. As we are all aware this is not just a school concern, but a community/society issue that we are facing at present. While in classes Sharon conducted a survey amongst the students and our school data is very similar to other schools. Since Sharon's visit earlier this term, there has been a press release that Quitline are now accepting teens and children who want support to quit vaping. No minimum age for support – they are keen to help all ages with quitting vaping (and not dependent on if they've smoked previously either). This is a real positive as vaping continues to increase amongst teens.








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### T.I.S Breakfast Club

# **Uniform**

Plain Navy Blue Trackpants: (available from – Brand fuel) Optional for winter – choice of straight or gathered leg at ankle. (No logos or snappants) N.B. Black is not allowed.

Footwear: Plain Black Shoes or Black Leather Roman Sandals – Back strap worn done up (N.B. Toe covered shoes must be worn in all technology classes – this is a requirement from OSH.)
