It's term 3 week 2 and TIS is in full swing again. Last week we introduced our new three week rotation timetable to our students. Throughout this term there will be a real emphasis on celebrating our students involved in the performing arts. In week 4, our dance crews are gearing up for the Dance NZ Made competition, as well as our two school bands who will be performing in the Bandquest Waikato competition in Hamilton. Our production cast, dancers and support crews are tirelessly rehearsing and working hard to piece together all the roles connected to the school production in readiness for our term 4 production evenings. To finish off the term our talented musicians will be involved in the Big Music Day held at the Great Lakes Centre. This is a busy term for our talented performers and we wish them well as they prepare and perform for these upcoming events.
