The success is also a testament to her passion for dance and skill as a dance teacher.












ATTENDANCE

Student Categories	Student with	Equivalent to
Regular attendance	over 90% attendance	missing fewer than 5 days across a term
Irregular absence	more than 80% and up to 90% attendance	absent for between 5 and 9 days across a term
Moderate absence	more than 70% and up to 80% attendance	absent for between 10 and 14.5 days across a term
Chronic absence	70% attendance or less	absent for 15 days or more across a school term

Whanau will be receiving a letter shortly for those students below 70% attendance rate for Term 3. This is only for those with unexplained or unjustified reasons.

Please ensure when you contact the school promptly if your child is away with a reason for the absence. The teacher or office will then record this in their notes and assign the correct code.

Enrolment into College 2025


All students have now been notified if they were accepted into the ballot for Taupo Nui a Tia College or Tauhara College.
