As mentioned in previous newsletters, I am very excited about the teaching and learning happening in our classrooms this year. Most classes have settled well into their weekly timetables, systems, and structures. Teachers, learning assistants, and students are building positive, learning-focused relationships, which is evident throughout the school.

At the beginning of the week, we welcomed Mrs. Shivani Chand to Room 7. She is an experienced teacher who will undoubtedly make a significant impact on her students' learning and progress. Her passion for making a difference in our students' lives and embodying the TIS values is truly inspiring. We also welcomed Mrs. Victoria Reeve to our teaching team on Wednesday. Mrs. Reeve will be working alongside our staff, providing additional induction support to new teachers, supporting beginning teachers, and assisting with classroom release time when needed. Unfortunately, even a small percentage of students displaying inappropriate behaviour can impact the culture and reputation of the school. We appreciate the support of parents and caregivers in reinforcing positive behaviour expectations at home.

On a more positive note, it is wonderful to see our Student Leaders stepping up and serving as excellent role models in their classes and around the school. This week, our Class Leaders are being confirmed, and we will acknowledge them at next week's assembly. Additionally, our Class Leaders will have the exciting opportunity to attend the upcoming Papamoa Leadership Camp and collaborate with the Taupō Nui-a-Tia College Year 12 PE students on March 20-21. At TIS, we believe in fostering young leaders, and in the coming weeks, we will continue to expand our leadership team by selecting our Sports Leaders, School Librarians, and School IT Leaders.

Congratulations to all our students who are embracing the TIS Way and making a fantastic start to 2025. I am thoroughly enjoying the positive culture this year and the opportunity to engage with students in their classrooms and in the playground. This is our school, and together, we can all be leaders by supporting and encouraging those around us with friendly reminders when needed!
