# ROOM 24 KOTAHITANGA INQUIRY

#### Room 24 Kotahitanga Inquiry

Room 24 has explored historical relationships as part of our Kotahitanga/Togetherness inquiry this term. In the past two weeks we have looked at the relationships between Māori and Pākehā before the Treaty of Waitangi, specifically at the arrival of missionaries and what the power relationship was like between the two groups. Our assessment piece was to choose the perspective of either a Māori rangatira (chief), a missionary, a young Māori learner, or a Pākehā trader who has observed relationships between Māori and the missionaries, then to create either a journal or a comic strip to show this perspective. We have looked at how relationships change over time, that power between different groups changes over time, and how different groups have different views of the same event, depending on their perspective. Our next steps will be to self assess our learning using rubrics. For the remainder of the term, we are focusing on modern relationships of groups in NZ and how they have changed over time,
