Dear parents, caregivers, students, families, and the wider community. E nga mātua, e nga kaitiaki, e nga tauira, e nga whānau, me te iwi whānui.

This week, we were thrilled to welcome three new staff members to our TIS whānau: Mrs. Kriza Serrano-Dela Cruz (Room 10 classroom teacher), Ms. Giovanna Frizon (full-time learning assistant), and Mr. Cameron Bradley (part-time learning assistant). With our 2025 teaching team now complete and additional staff supporting student learning and behaviour, we are excited about the year ahead!

Our recent focus has been on our TIS value of 'INVOLVEMENT.' It has been wonderful to see so many students eager to participate in various activities. Our kapa haka group has over 120 enthusiastic students signed up for 2025, and while numbers may settle, the energy and excitement have been inspiring. Band auditions have wrapped up, and practices are underway for Band quest. Our music and ukulele group meets regularly, with a small ukulele group even performing at this week's assembly. Additionally, our Super 11 Sports and Taupō Kiwi sports programmes are starting up, and students are signing up for trials and teams. Saturday morning netball trials are also in full swing. We love seeing students explore and engage in these opportunities!

We are currently reviewing our Bevan Docherty, Donovan Bixley, and Principal's Academic Awards to align with the new school and community events happening in 2025. Our goal is to have these award cards ready for distribution by the end of Week 6.

Last week, we mentioned that the leadership team and staff are actively working on improving student behaviour and ensuring a safer school environment. While it is never ideal to have students stood down or suspended, we have had to take appropriate disciplinary actions this week due to repeated disobedience and inappropriate behaviours. These measures are necessary steps to maintain a positive and respectful learning environment for all students.

Another area of concern has been the use of student bathrooms. Staff, parents, caregivers, and students have raised this issue, and in response, the TIS Board has taken proactive steps by installing HALO—a monitoring system that detects vapor, noise, and tampering. When activated, HALO immediately alerts the Leadership Team, allowing us to follow up right away. Our goal is to provide a safe and comfortable bathroom environment for all students.

Meet the Teacher Evening is scheduled for Thursday, 20 March, at 6:00 PM. This is a great opportunity for you to meet your child's teacher, learn about classroom expectations and programmes, and discuss any questions you may have about your child's learning journey.

Finally, we want to extend a big thank you to all parents and caregivers who ensure their children arrive at school on time, ready to learn, and in the correct uniform. Your ongoing support is greatly appreciated and plays a huge role in your child's success at TIS.



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
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ROOM 20 LETTER WRITING UNIT
