#### Student Support Focus at TIS

This week at Tāupo Intermediate School has been relatively quiet in terms of events, but we've been focused on a crucial task: our students have successfully completed their e-asTTle assessments in reading, writing, and mathematics. For those students who needed extra help, additional support was provided to ensure they could finish their assessments.

Over the past two years, our Student Support Hub, under the leadership of Mrs. Emma Voysey, has grown and evolved significantly. Currently, we have more than 250 students on our Student Support Register. To meet the individual needs of our students, we've expanded from 3 learning assistants to 11. These learning assistants play a vital role in providing targeted support for students across various areas.

To further support our students, we are working closely with several community groups to address their social and emotional needs through a range of activities outside the classroom. These programs include:

- Aspire Programme (mixed group)
- Jujitsu (separate boys' and girls' programmes)
- Ringcraft Boxing (separate boys' and girls' programmes)
- Young Pioneers Programme (boys' group)
- **Grannies Reading Programme (mixed group)**
- Tē Tu Pā Harakeke Programme (girls' group)
- **REAL Counselling (individual 1-on-1 sessions)**
- Seasons for Grief Programme (mixed group)
- He Kahui Tangata Mentoring (mixed group)
- Wairiki Mana Ake Mentoring & Psychologist Support (individual 1-on-1 sessions)

In addition to the community programs, our learning assistants are also offering numeracy intervention groups (Levels 1/2) and literacy withdrawal groups (Levels 1/2) for targeted students. They also provide invaluable support within the classroom to help students thrive.

We are also excited to offer additional programs in dance and drama, Te Ao Māori, Obstacle Course Racing (OCR), and Bricks. At Tāupo Intermediate School, we are dedicated to making a positive impact on our students, particularly those with learning, behaviour, social, and emotional challenges. Our wide range of support programs reflects our commitment to ensuring every student has the tools they need to succeed. A huge thank you to our incredible Student Support Team for their ongoing dedication and hard work.









